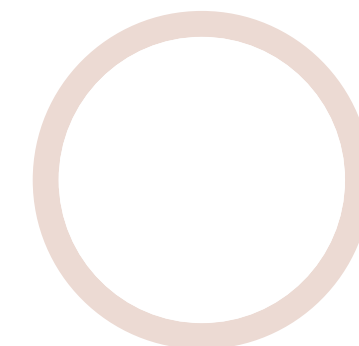

“You will know that I am the LORD your God”

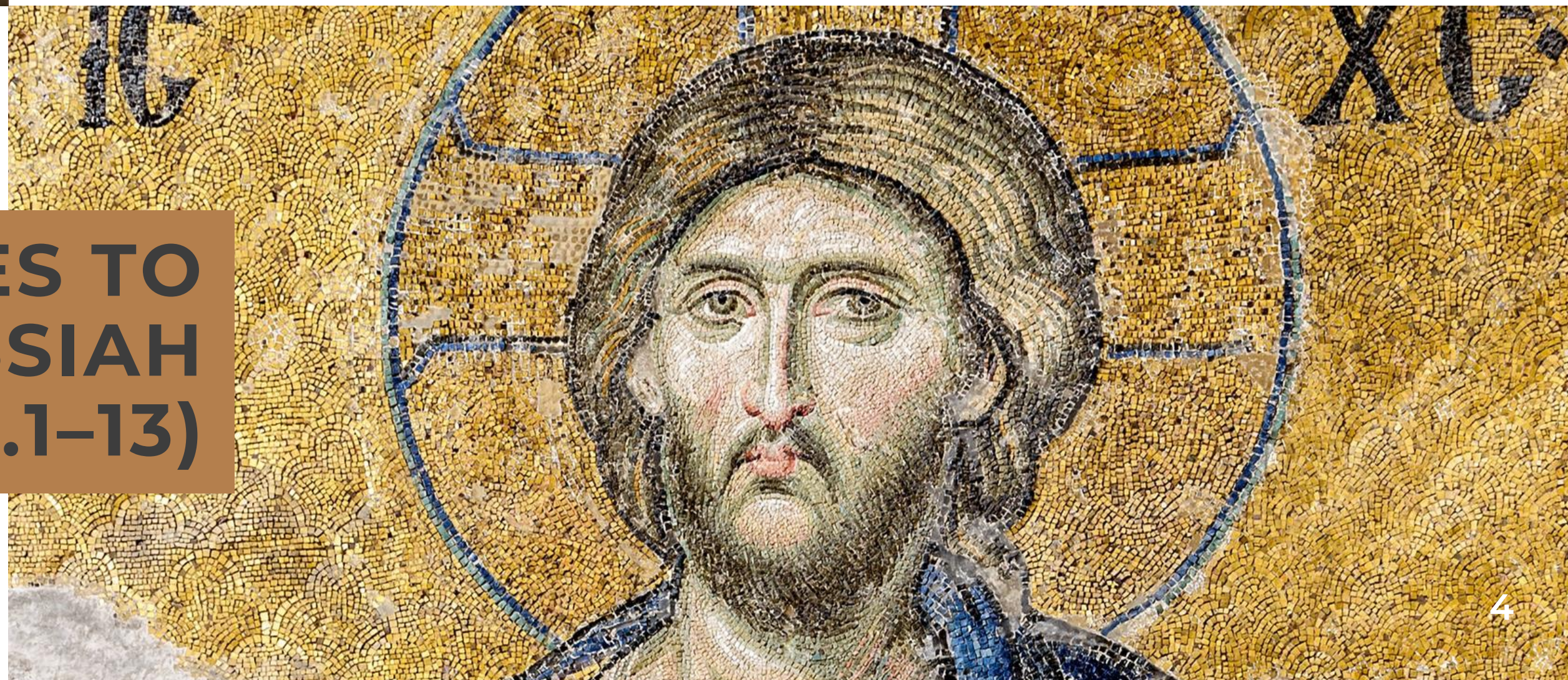
► **PROMISE**

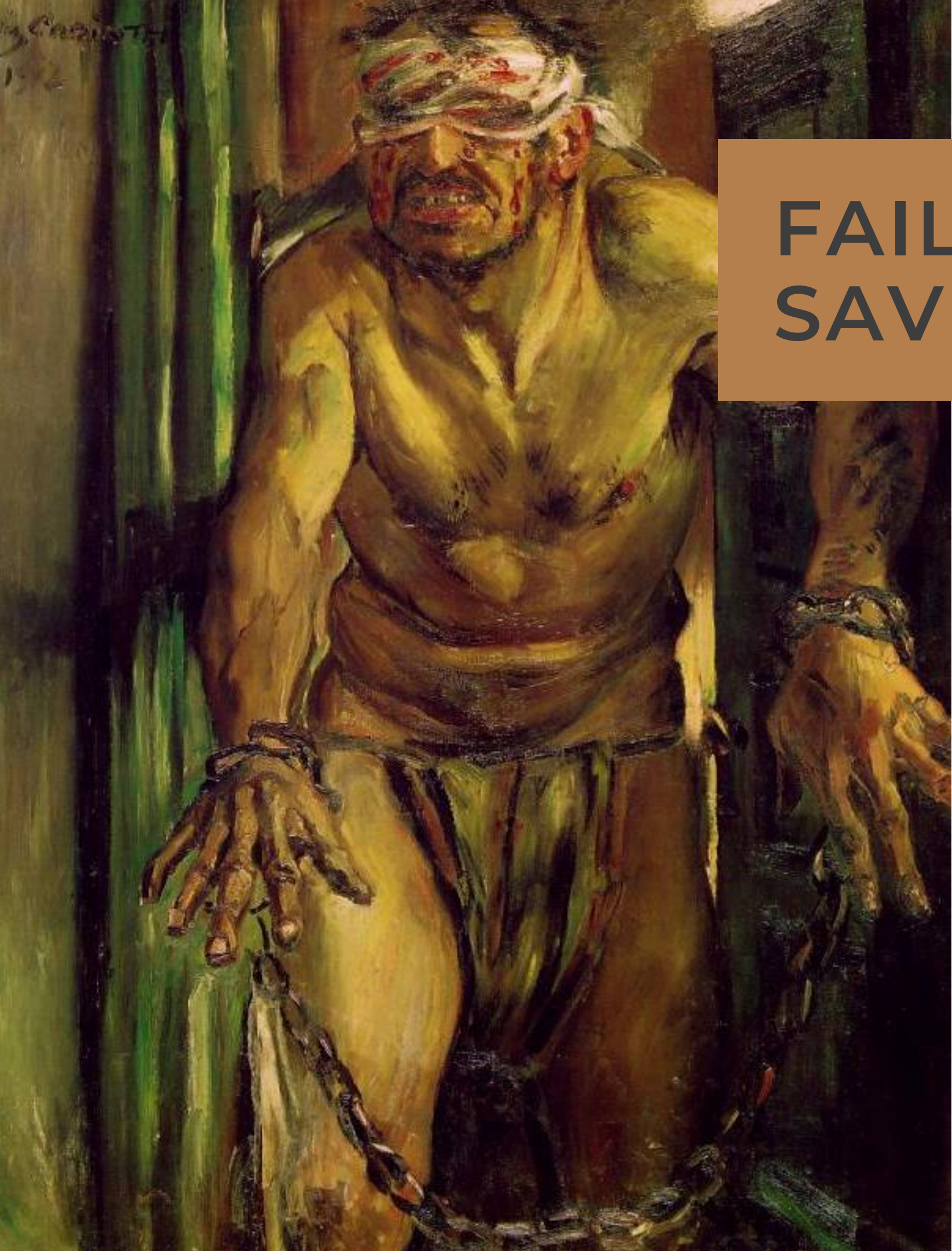
“I will give you the land that I swore to give to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob...”
