“The Gospel of Jesus the Christ, the son of God” (1.1)



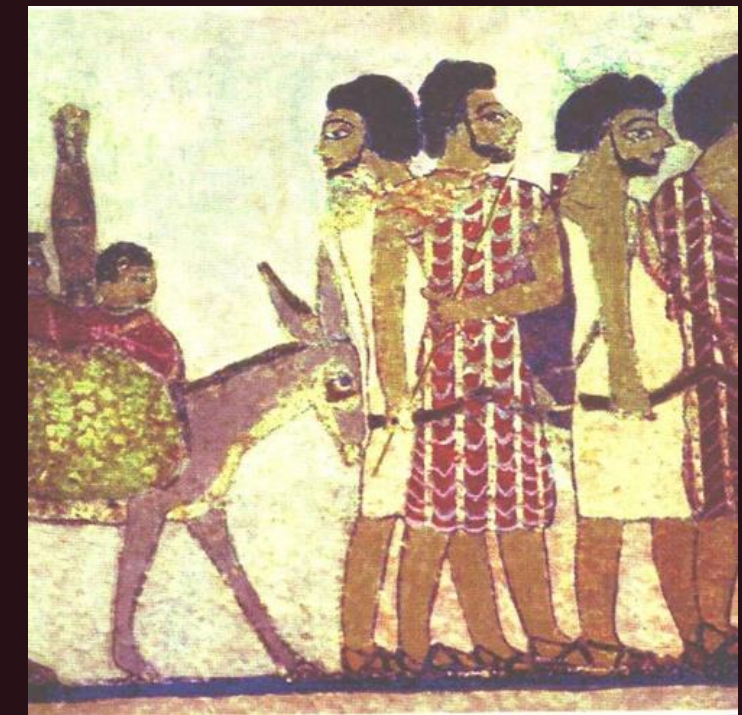
Son of God

King

“The time is fulfilled, the Kingdom of God has come near” (1.15)



Slave

“The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve...” (10.45)

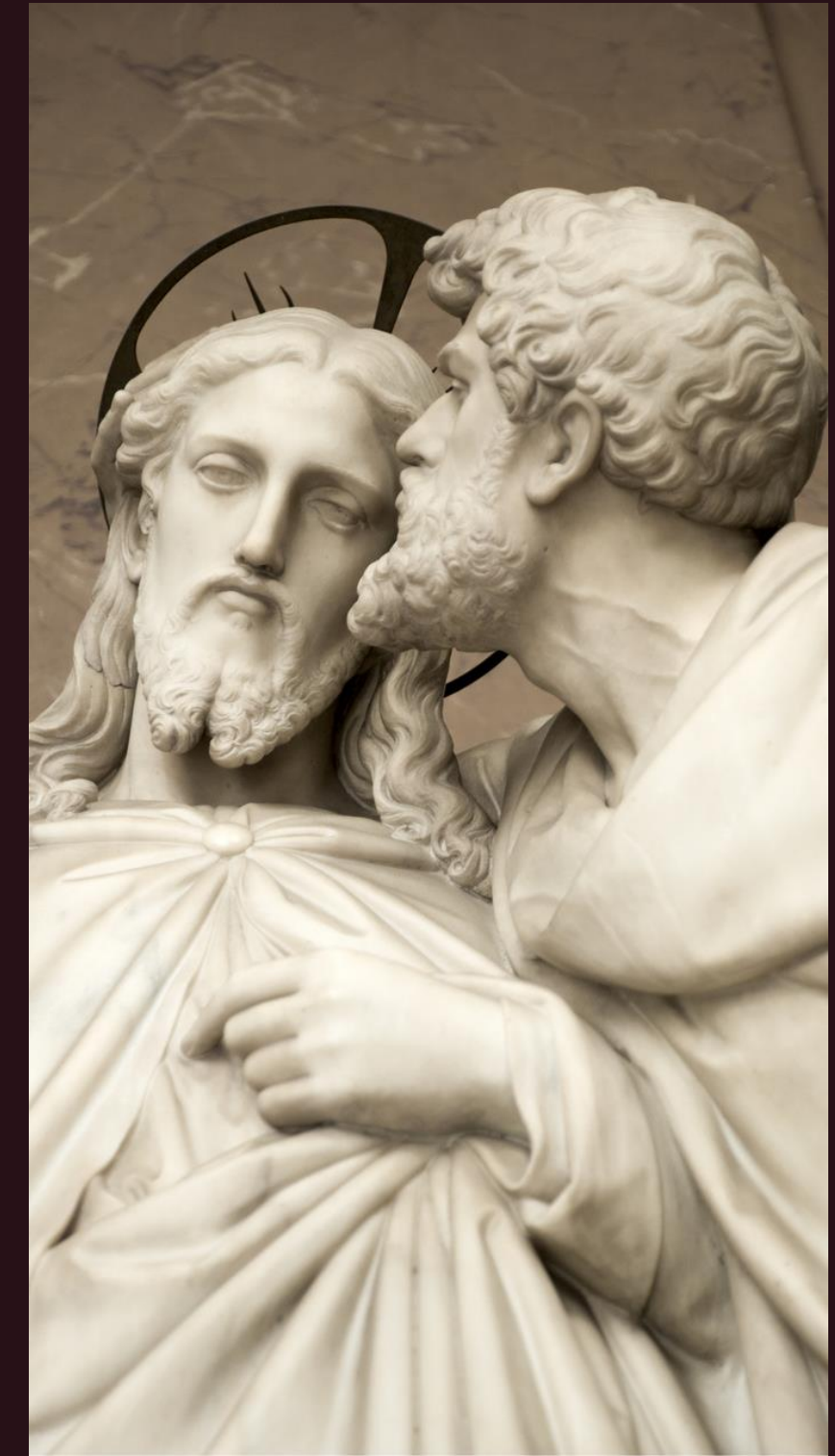

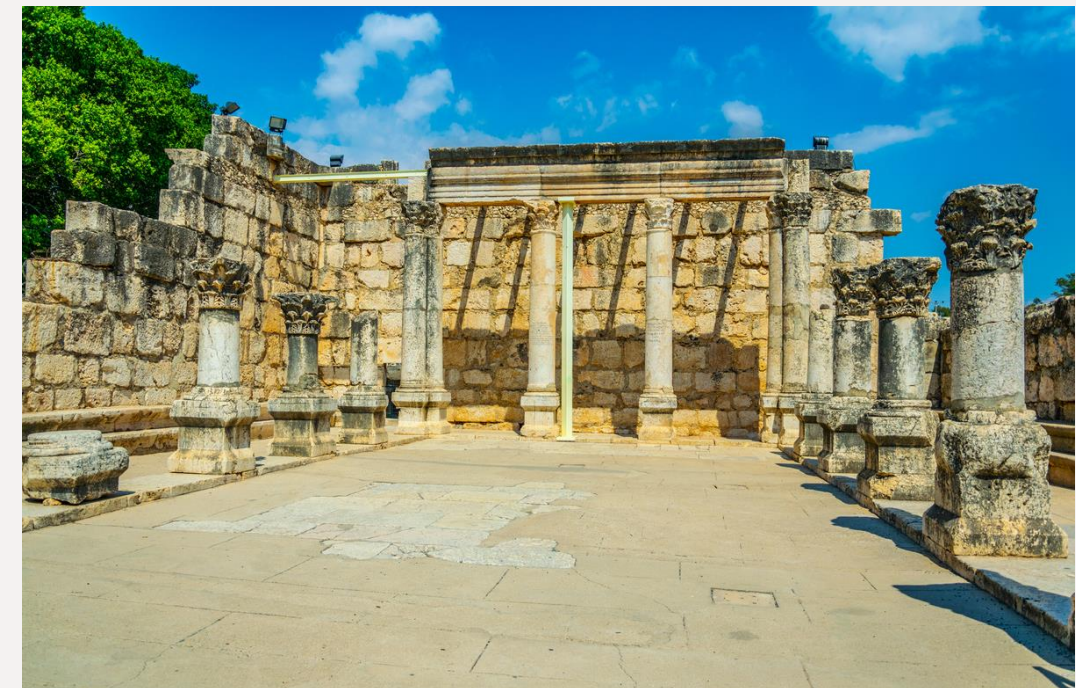
