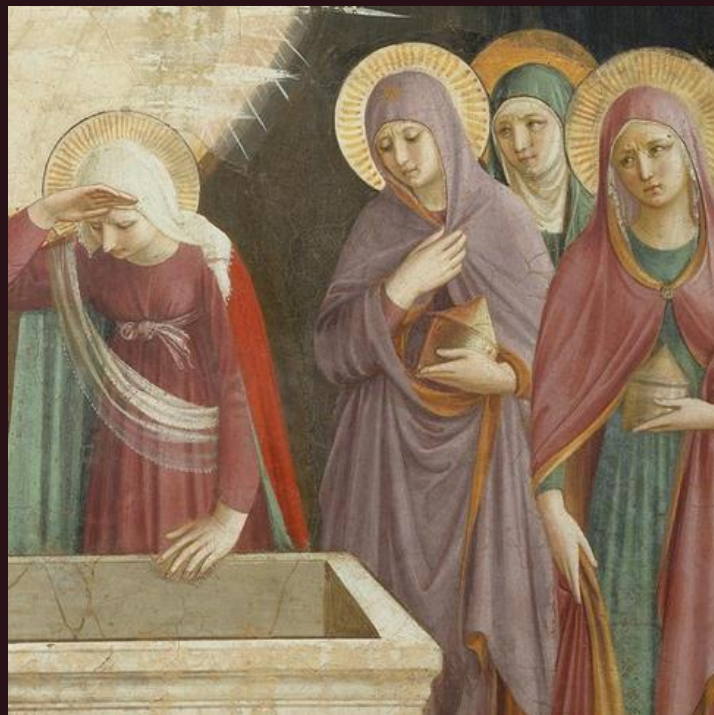

“And immediately...”

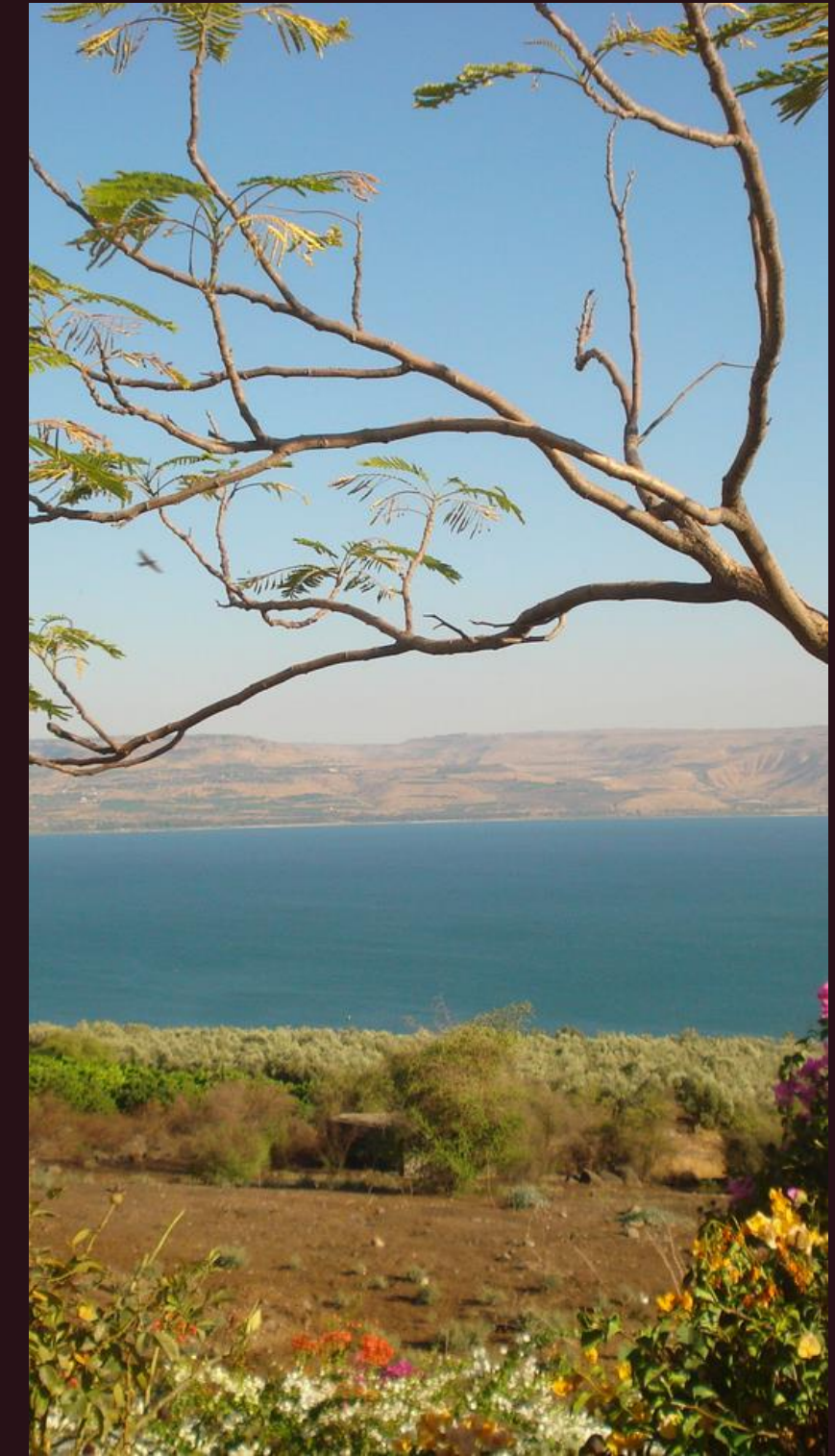
## 6.47–50
